First off, it's actually the “Mark's Models, Perpetual Award, Outstanding Member” award, as shown in the photo below. As shown below, the award was sponsored by Mark's Models. Gary Fogel, TPG Historian, sent me the following about Mark's Models:

“Mark Smith was amazing. He operated Mark's Models in Escondido and was a member of both TPG and Harbor Slope Soaring Society in OC. He used to donate considerable time and effort to TPG, especially in its formative years.”

The second recipient was Kelly Pike. Gary shared this with me:

"TPG started in about 1969, mainly out of the effort of Jim and Kelly Pike. I am still in touch with Kelly Pike. He and his family live in Half Moon Bay. At the time, Kelly was a high school student and there was a growing group of RCers flying at Torrey in the early to mid – 1960s. Their idea was to pull them together as a club. Jim (his dad) passed away many years ago."

Our club is approaching its 50th anniversary! This is a testament to the (obsessive) commitment to our hobby and to the dedication of our members. In the coming months, with Gary's help, I plan to learn more about the Club's history and the other names on this trophy, so I can share it here.

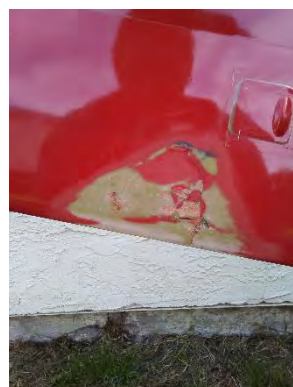

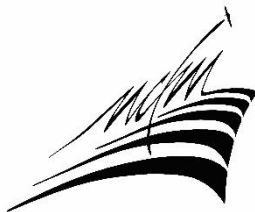
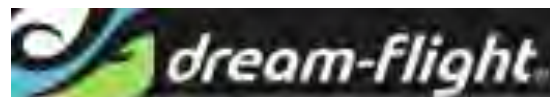


Photo of the Month Contest
