My 60 min Slope task was completed with my replacement Ka-8 at Torrey with no radio issues. Dale Osborn completed his 5 min Thermal LSF1 task with his Blaster at Poway. On the same day, Don Lockhead completed his second 5 min thermal task as a replacement for his 15 min slope task for LSF 1, and I completed my 15 min thermal task with my Aerial Light.

Sagitta 600 Scratch Build – Eric Metzdorff



1980's TWF Sagitta! – Al Schmadtke

And here's some more from our friend AI in New York about his twisty-wing Sagitta!

Hello Gentlemen,

Attached, please see my chicken scratch drawings!

Lenny Hauf came up with the "twist wing" mod for the Sagittas that we flew back in the day. Lenny is the guy standing on the right with his modified Sagitta 900. In addition to the twist wing, he also added length to the straight sections of the wings in order to get to 112" wingspan. He either thickened or increased the size of the stab, I can't remember. We were all impressed with the way it flew (and the way he did so well our local contests) that it started to become a club mod. He shared his ideas freely and would even let you fly his planes! The complete package had a Rocket City captured tow hook!

So, with some re-engineering, a servo was jam mounted (top screwed) into a vertical position near the rear wing pin. A new pin was bent to a Z shape and epoxied into the tube on the wing. Du-Bro ball links were used to drive the twist wing. We picked a spot on the servo to anchor the metal ball part so we could get the effect of aileron differential. For the 600, the rear of the wing lifted about 3/8" while it only dropped about half of that. The concept behind not cutting ailerons into the wing was to save weight and drag. These were sweet planes to fly with this mod, even better than the poly version. Some guys left a small amount of poly, they felt it was an even better mod.


Our spoiler mod was to add two pieces of 1/16" ID brass tube. One tube was mounted to the shear webbing on the inboard side of the spoiler opening and the other to the outboard side of the spoiler. A 1/64" wire was bent in a U shape, with one leg at 1/2" long and the other leg about 1". The bends were made the same distance apart as the tubes were glued in. This became a torsion spring that held the spoiler closed during launch and high speed flight. Throw away the stick on weights that came in the kit!


I stumbled upon the article that Eric was writing and was very happy to see someone actually building a Sagitta. This was an extremely well designed, easy to build airplane and a very durable one too. I don't ever recall seeing a 600 blow up on the winch. We did bend the wing rods in the 900's! Carry on Eric!


