Safety tip:

Make sure your receiver batteries are healthy. Double check that the battery is fully charged before your flight. Measure the battery voltage, add a <u>VoltWatch</u>, install a low voltage alarm, purchase a radio system with telemetry. If in doubt, throw it out.



Today there are many inexpensive smart battery chargers that will cycle your battery, keeping track of the milliamps going in and out.

2S LiFe batteries provide 5 cell voltage at ½ the weight and 1/4th the cost. LiFe batteries hold their charge forever or till your next flight, whichever is shorter.

With smart chargers monitoring the health of your batteries, and batteries that cost and weigh less than equivalent NiMh batteries, there is little reason to lose a plane over receiver battery issues.


