Thanks everyone for coming to the contest and for helping me setup and tear-down. Thanks especially to Amardeep for the scoring help. I was hoping for capped out thermals for the first round as I wanted to run a poker round where 9:58 was impossible. However, I was disappointed with booming lift for this round and the next two. I selected rounds with lots of air time, and we made the most of it. After the break the thermals got even stronger, yet where still easy to find, until the end of heat A of round five. Just as the closing buzzer sounded, all the surrounding lift lifted off in one huge suck, leaving nothing but windy sink for heat B. The lift returned for heat A of round six, all up last down, then once again abandoned heat B.

That said, a good pilot can get a bad draw and still win. Paul Anderson and Mike Smith, who took first and second, each flew in one of those B heats, but they each won their heat. Gregg Bolton took third with an impressive 4,968 and was in both of the tough heat Bs. Nice work guys!

## Katie Martin Tribute Fly-In IV

On June 7, Bob Martin, RC modeling pioneer, along with the Torrey Pines Gulls hosted the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Katie Martin Tribute Fly-In. Bob contributed the following article. Thanks, Bob for all you and Katie have done for RC Soaring!

In December of 2010, Katie Martin passed away in Cedar Sinai hospital from heart and lung complications. In all things, from when we got married in June 1964, Katie was my constant companion. We were well matched and throughout our lives, we participated in nearly everything together.

In the early seventies Katie asked me to buy her a sailplane, a Hobie Hawk. Shortly thereafter Bob Martin RC Models was launched. When we lost her in 2010, friends put together the idea for the Tribute. Discussion with your club began and the first Katie Martin Tribute was launched in June 2011 at the obvious location, the Mecca of slope soaring in the US.

It has been four years that the Torrey Pines Gulls have hosted the Katie Martin Tribute. Last year and this year, flyers in Great Britain, Spain and Venezuela have joined us here in the states in honoring Katie.

I cannot fully express my gratitude to the members of the Torrey Pines Gulls for their gracious hospitality. All of the members I have met are a great bunch of guys and I look forward to coming to Torrey Pines Glider Port each year.

The 2014 edition of the Katie Martin Global Tribute was a huge success. How would Katie define success? Easy, did everyone have a good time, if so it is a success. This year the weather was fantastic, strong enough and the right direction that we could fly anything we wanted but not so strong that it grounded the lighter aircraft.
