Encinitas Update

The field is coming together. Approved TPG Signage is installed on the incoming fence and at the field for all the rules and regulations. Two trash cans have been added, so please clean up after and put your trash into the cans provided.

We have improved on the well and piping protection, the parking area now has proper cover of 4 inches of Class II base. The winch and retriever system has been refined. High starts connections have been provided.

We are moving forward with a battery charging system (solar) for all batteries. The landing area has been defined clearly. We had several work parties and club members have helped in bring the field together. The area has almost been completed mowed and cleaned up. We have 2 new retrievers and stands. Remember the field is for club members in good standing and their guests only.

The County has informed us of two important issues.

1. Vandalism at Encinitas II (The landfill) has occurred from rock damage (\$500) and the Club has been asked to notify the Sheriff's Department of any strange or threatening occurrences. I told the County we will keep our eyes open for any vandals and notify the sheriff

if we see any activity that is not normal.

2. The County plans to import about 20,000 cyd of soil to Encinitas starting in the next few weeks. The dirt haul will occur Tuesday through Friday. The hauling operation could take a good 3 to 4 weeks to complete, so when flying be aware and try and keep out of their way during that operation.

We are still fine tuning the field and operation. It will be ready for the SC2 contest October 26, 2008. We always need help at these contest. So come out and help...it would be a good time to come out to the field and see the operation.

What's Doing at Poway?

Powa is looking good. Mike Smith has been very involved, read in charge of, "remodeling" the Poway site to accommodate all the changes to the horse and agricultural activities there. We are in a situation where we will be able to use the Poway location, though they would like us to be sort of a "minimal" presence there.

The owners have agreed to let us use the northwest corner of the property for launching and landing and are planting tomatoes in our old flying area. The board of directors has struggled with our options and feel it is best to keep a minimal presence in Poway, focusing on F3B practice, "sport" flying and occasional powered flying. This means we will not support the site with available winches, as Encinitas has taken over that role. Raterr, club members will be welcome to use the Poway site as they wish with either their own winches, high starts or hand launches. We do not expect to use the field for formal competitions, however, either for the club, SC2 or IHLGF (still to be made final).

There will likely be a new parking area and a levelled launch and land area. There will be even more space than previously, so we are still blessed with a fantastic flying site.

Encinitas Rocks

It was early Sunday morning that TPG pilots began to gather at the top of the drive at 3099 Encinitas Boulevard in Encinitas. The marine layer was pretty thick and not much wind was stirring. Lots of humidity made for heavy air and there was some concern that the sun would penetrate the fog layer. Cars began pulling up to the parking area, doubled up and spread to across the driveway. Fuselages and wings were being assembled and soon a DLG popped up into the grey sky and slowly felt its way to an ignoble landing in the cut grass. Necessities were assembled and the CD finally took his place at the registration table, busily making change and jousting with the growing collection of pilots assembling in the morning mist.

It was the maiden contest for Torrey Pines Gulls at the new, Encinitas thermal site. Club members, led by both Keith Finkenbiner Cliff Hunter, with lots of help from Parviz Kamiab had come together and worked hard to make the site one to be proud of. Keith headed the cutting and assembling of perimeter barricades to fence off the parking area and "keep off" zones. A generous four inches of gravel had been spread on the parking lot to keep from making ruts in the somewhat delicate surface of the landfill. The weeds had been mowed with the new club tractor, some this early morning. The new container was in place and the trailer parked neatly beside it. Protectors for the methane pipes would soon be constructed, but temporary protection was in place. The new site was ready to go.

Mike Smith took a practice, demonstration flight to illustrate the rules, like where to launch and land, how to avoid the no-fly zone, follow the suggested landing pattern and such. The group was itching to go, but watched with rapt attention. The winches were strung from their new concrete bases to the turnarounds hung on the fencing on the west end of the field. Soon it was time to launch.

With almost flawless precision, planes launched for their 3, 5, 7 and 10 minute tasks. More than 20 pilots had assembled for this maiden contest and it was well worth the apprehension. Even though we had several who hiked over the ridge toward the approach road to retrieve their ships from the voracious rotors just beyond the landing area, we lost no ships. Meanwhile, the sky was filled with colorful, composite wings and even a woodie or two as thermals were sought and found. Some flew flawlessly; some not so much. But, the bottom line, a good time was had by all!
