

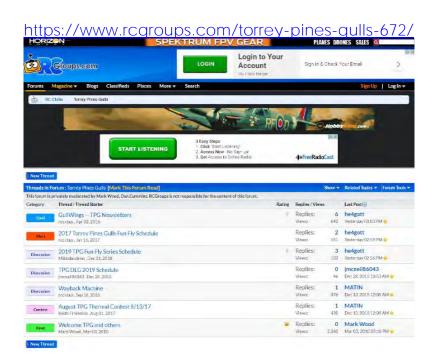
RCGroups - Torrey Pines Gulls Forum



Below, Ian Cummings enjoys some fresh air and a good breeze, while Thomas Moller launches Stephen Peters' Arcus.





TIP

Cliff rescues occur 3-4 times per year at Torrey. The Gliderport is frequently used as a landing zone for the Rescue Helicopter. Obviously, we need to land our gliders to make room for the Heli. If you hear or see an ambulance or fire trucks at Torrey, be prepared for the Flight Director to ask all Gliders (RC, PG and HG) to clear the air for the rescue copter.

Thermal Duration Contest Report - Cliff Hunter

The 2019 TD contests have started slowly due to December and January being rained out.

All TD contests are held at the Encinitas flying site, located at 2099 Encinitas Blvd, Encinitas, CA 9204 – old landfill. There are two gates with keyed access. The following are Encinitas Field Regulations:

- Radio Controlled Sailplanes Only NO Power or Electric flying allowed
- Club Members in good standing only Guests welcome
- Gates shall remain locked for landfill security.
- Hours of Operation 8am 6pm 7, days a week
- No flying within 100 feet of power lines located to the north and over the homes, west, and south of the field
- No flying entry to site after a rain of 1/4 inch or more for at least 5 full days
- Maintenance will occur between the hours of 8am 5pm Monday Friday.
- No Driving on the landfill stay on roadway or defined parking areas
- Wells & Methane piping shall be protected at all times from damage by sailplanes. No climbing or driving on or near methane system
- Please maintain a peaceful and quiet flying area.
- Remove your trash and put in trash cans at site.
- For Emergencies, dial 9-1-1 Field location is 2099 Encinitas Blvd, Encinitas, CA 92024.
- For TPG Club needs or concerns, please contact Field Safety Officer Cliff Hunter at 760-703-4497.

Thermal Duration Contest Report (continued)





The following is the contest format we use:

- Thermal Duration Soring Contest, may be AMA sanctioned, AMA cards required to fly.
- Pilots Meeting: 8:45 am
- Entry Fee: \$5.00 for members and \$10.00 non-members Contest Director does not pay the entry fee! All fees go to maintenance of the equipment and field.
- Contest Starts: 9:00 am; ends around noon.
- Field mowed grass or dirt depending on the time of year
- Three Classes: Masters, Experts and Sportsman
- Computer Scoring at the field

Tasks: normally are 4 rounds, time in the air soaring, in minutes.

Scoring: normally 900 flight points and 100 landing points.

The task and scoring are determined by the Contest Director (CD)

DLG Contest Report - Gary Fogel

On January 19 we had a nice showing of pilots for our first discus launch glider contest of the year. 16 pilots had signed up. In the end, 15 showed in addition to several timers who we hope will enter as pilots next month. The contest was officially the "Rollo Invitational II" as Roland Sommer had made the trip from Germany. Not to be outdone, Nate Sjoberg also made the trip from Sweden. When TPG advertises a monthly contest, we pull them in from everywhere!

The field was very green after a solid week of rain. The thermals, however, were there but weak and really didn't start developing more regularly until about the third round of the contest. It required some patience to eke out times in zero sink. Building high pressure aloft made it difficult.

At about 10:50am, after the end of Round 4, we took a break to learn about how to transport DLGs in sport tubes for international travel, but also to see if the launch of the ULA Delta IV rocket would be visible from Vandenberg AFB. This would have been spectacular in the evening, but as it was, the rocket launched on YouTube but we didn't see a thing in the sky. Was it really a launch or just a Hollywood stunt? We'll never know.

After that, play resumed, and we finished the contest with all up last downs to see who could throw to orbit. Some pilots make it seem like they are using rocket boost. Not me. Thanks to everyone who helped with setup and take down, especially Don Lochhead with his excellent notes on how to set up and run one of these things. If you haven't CD'd a contest before, this is a good one to try! If you are interested, let me know. The next contest in the series is February 16, with our own Don Lochhead as CD. Come out and have fun and learn some new skills.

Start out at Poway and knock out the landing and thermal tasks then head to Torrey for the easy-peasy slope task. It would be nice for someone to take on this challenge and maybe write an article for the AMA magazine.

AIAA SciTech 2019 - Gary Fogel

Each year the American Institute of Astronautics and Aeronautics (AIAA) has a large conference in January called AIAA SciTech (https://scitech.aiaa.org/About/). It rotates between San Diego, Orlando, and Texas annually. This year it was held in San Diego and I'd estimate that about 5,000 people attended at the convention center downtown. The meeting runs for an entire week. There are many sessions in parallel, some on the latest in aerospace, other forums to discuss specific topics, etc. This year there was a very popular technical session on aerospace history that I was pleased to be a part of. Over 25 papers were in the session, presented at various times during the week. I had the pleasure of having three papers accepted, one on an early aviatrix in San Diego named Ruth Alexander, another on the formation of the Aero Club of California, and a third as a comparison of wing warping approaches between the Wright Brothers and John Montgomery. All three of these had a connection to gliding - Ruth was the second woman in the US to earn a second-class glider license (Anne Lindbergh predated her in this by just a few weeks) and Ruth also was the first female glider instructor in the US. The Aero Club of California (based in LA) was the state's first club dedicated to aviation and also held the first glider contest in state history in 1909. The winner of that contest flew his hang glider for a distance of about 25 feet. Lastly of course Montgomery was working on his early gliders here near San Diego in the 1880s and those efforts were instrumental in the wing warping he used in 1904-1905 in the bay area. As it turns out, both the Wrights and Montgomery patented their wing warping systems, and the same patent examiner at the US Patent Office reviewed them at nearly the same time, approving them both.

Also, 2019 represents the 50th anniversary of the Apollo Moon landing, and I had the pleasure of leading a technical session on this history at the meeting. Later, one of the original Apollo astronauts Dave Scott and others joined in a wonderful panel to review the history associated with the guidance computer on Apollo. Other remembrances of Apollo are being arranged for this year - and some might be especially interested in an even being arranged by the San Diego Air and Space Museum to honor the crew of Apollo 9. Our local museum is fortunate to have the original Apollo 9 command module "Gumdrop" and we are also fortunate that the three crew members are still alive. Tickets are now available for a gala that will be held at the museum on March 13 to honor these heroes. For more information:

This Month: Reg Moore, 1985 Modeler of the Year

Reggie (Reg) Moore is another one of those Gulls that I just do not have a lot of information about. The newsletters suggest that he joined the TPG in about 1981 and volunteered quickly to serve as Treasurer in 1982. But oddly, none of the 1982 newsletters mention anything about him, indicating that as a newbie he was still just getting the hang of RC and wasn't yet interested in contests (either thermal or slope).

Reg kindly continued as Treasurer in 1983 (There is that thing about momentum – Board positions that are in motion stay in motion). In 1983 he began to try his luck with thermal duration contests, specifically for the popular 2-meter class, placing 10th out of 19 in the June contest. By October his luck was improving ... he placed 9th out of 20.

In 1984 Reg continued once again as Treasurer (Newton was pleased again). But by this time he was also entering slope contests in addition to thermal duration. placing 8th of 9 in the March slope race at Torrey. In June 1984 at the club thermal contest he placed 5th out of 14 in 2-meter, and 6th out of 19 in open. In August he placed third at the monthly TD contest in 2-meter. He finally placed first at the October TD contest in 2-meter and 5th in open. The skills were definitely improving!

As the TPG Board meetings were often held at his house, Reg continued as Treasurer again in 1985. (Ah, the lure of money).



TPG History: The Trophy (continued)

This was at a time when people would regularly volunteer for new positions in the club, so to have someone hold an office for four years in a row was considered seriously above and beyond the call of duty. Reg kept flying and doing well at contests – and of course volunteered again in 1986 to serve as Treasurer. (Why not?) By now Reg was routinely placing in the top 3 in contests. He had finished 1985 in third overall in both Open Class TD and 2-meter TD.

In those days the annual award banquet was held in February instead of December to honor the prior year's awards. So in 1986 the Awards Banquet (for effort in 1985) was held February 15 at the Jolly Roger Restaurant on Clairemont Mesa Blvd between Convoy and 163 (and yes, the restaurant is still there!). Al Doig was the featured speaker, and showed slides of his recent trip flying RC in New Zealand and Australia. Also at the time, votes by the membership were cast for Member of the Year. And the race was tight with Reg Moore, Steven O'Leary, and Hap Merrifield nearly tying.
