Tuesday Jan 9, 7:00pm San Diego Aerospace Museum, Balboa Park property and pilots ignoring his posted No Trespassing signs while searching for a model. Regardless of how any one pilot may feel, it is imperative that we get along with our neighbors in Poway. He explained where his property line is, and it is much larger than I had believed. We have been lucky to use the Poway field for over 14 years, and hopefully we will be able to continue to fly peacefully into

the future.

In order to maintain our relations with the neighbors, we have instituted a No-Fly zone over the property to the east. The southern boundary is defined as a line that extends from the pits to the peak of the mountain on the Southeast of the field. The northern boundary is a line that extends to the east along the road past the largest eucalyptus tree on his property (big tree at the turn for your landing approach). We must not fly in this area, no matter what the altitude. Further, his property starts approximately 50 feet to the west of the tree line. Therefore there shall be no thermaling between the pits and the eucalyptus trees. This area is for landing approach only.

I appreciate everyone's consideration in respecting these new field boundaries. We still have lots of room to fly, and I believe we can all coexist. Please

2007 Thermal Duration Competition Rules

As your newly elected Contest Director, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a Happy New Year. During the past two years, Aaron Valdes has been working hard to coordinate the contests so we could all enjoy the hobby we love. I would like to thank Aaron for the job well done.

It is now my task to select Contest Directors, coordinate, and report the scores for each contest. As you all know, scheduling and organizing contests is not just flying and scoring. It requires field maintenance, equipment maintenance, taking the equipment to the field, setting up the winches, tearing down at the end of the day and finally taking the equipment back to its storage location. It takes more than a few members to make this happen. I would like to request that anyone and everyone participate in doing whatever it takes to make things move along smoothly.

Maybe this year we can have more participants in maintaining the field, maintaining the equipment, setting up the winches and tear down. And please don't forget and follow the rule for our most favorite subject, the "No Fly Zone". Overall we have done well in keeping our neighbor happy. We don't want Don Richmond to get any calls. So please take the "No Fly Zone" rule seriously.

My contact information is on the website and I am always available to discuss any concerns. You can contact me anytime and let me know of any suggestions you may have. My goal is to have a fun and successful season. I hope to see more and more of you out at the Poway field for our friendly monthly contests!

And now, the 2007 Torrey Pines Gulls Thermal Competition Rules: The 2007 competition season shall have two competition classes, flown at the same contest:

Unlimited and RES. Unlimited May be flown by any sailplane without motor. RES May be flown by any sailplane that is controlled by Rudder, Elevator and spoiler. No movable trailing edges may be used on the primary wing. There shall be four competitor classes flown in unlimited: Master, Expert, Sportsman and Novice. All classes will be determined by pilot's choice. There will be no standard for promotion. Competitors may advance to a higher class, but may not demote themselves. There shall be one competitor class flown in RES; all RES pilots will fly against each other. All contests shall have at least 4 rounds, subject to weather or other conditions. Contest Directors will coordinate tasks with the thermal coordinator, and provide contest announcement in the club newsletter. Announcement shall be submitted no later than the 15th of the month preceding the contest to the thermal coordinator and the newsletter editor.

All timing shall be consistent with the "rounding" method. Times which show X:XX.49 shall use the seconds shown on the watch

All competition classes and competitor classes shall be scored together at each contest. All scores shall be maintained to two decimal places. All Unlimited pilot classes shall be scored together and normalized to 1000 points. RES shall be normalized to 1000 points. The season championship shall be determined by the best 9 out of 12 contests. In case on contest cancellation, the following scales apply:

Year-end awards shall be given for Sportsman, Expert, Master and RES. Season "High Point" award shall be given to the competitor that accumulates the most points in Unlimited and RES, without throw out's.
