

When you are thinking of buying a hobbyrelated item, please consider these outstanding companies first. Joe Wurts literally "surf" his plane, approximately 50 feet downwind from where he stood, with no more altitude than 6 to 10 feet moving laterally across the field making a turn into the wind, gaining altitude in the turn, then trading the altitude for speed, then turning back into the wind repeating the process for over a minute.

The three day event, including the IHLAC (International Hand Launch Altitude Challenge) went pretty smoothly with all scheduled rounds and tasks being flown as prescribed. It was a



typical Poway weather weekend with Saturday having a bit of overcast until around three with the onshore breezes kicking up in the afternoon. Sunday was just about as perfect as it can get here in June with a slight overcast early in the morning and quickly clearing to a beautiful clear sky with temperatures in the low 70s.

Both days provided plenty of lift opportunities mixed in with just the right amount of challenging conditions to make the contest very interesting from the beginning to a very eventful ending. As with most contests, the cream usually rises to the top and the IHLGF 2007 was no different: we just have a thicker layer of cream here at the IHLGF than 10

deep. So, when you check out the scores you might see some people who normally are in the top ten vacant from that elite group. Note: You are required by the City of San Diego to annually sign a liability waiver form before permission to fly at Torrey Pines Glider Park will be granted. You may also encounter a similar requirement to fly at various other sites.
