



# News from the Slope - Mark Baldacchino, Slope Coordinator

Hopefully you've begun to decorate the house inside and out by now, and hopefully Santa will bring you a new plane or some kind of RC equipment! The daylight is short now, thus making it a time good to build something new or at least do some repairs/ refit on your existing plane(s).



#### Some news about the slope:

Last month, I mentioned that we needed some signage around the perimeter of our landing zone to help keep people from wondering around that area, especially when we're trying to land. This topic has been bouncing around for almost a year now, and we're getting closer to getting this done. At our last TPG board meeting, it was decided that TPG should <u>not</u> be responsible for the safety of that area, but rather, it is the responsibility of the Gliderport concessionaire, i.e. Ai California Adventure, Inc.

I had already sourced a place online to get 10 signs made, (like the open house signs you see on sidewalks with an "A" frame stand) and shipped for under \$300. With the direction of the TPG board, I took the idea to the manager of the Glider Port, Robin, to get his input. I mentioned that this area is really a safety concern, especially during the warmer months when more people are visiting San Diego or trying to find a path to the beach.

Robin said he has signs in the mobile shed, but people run-off with them or use them to stick under their tires to get unstuck from the mud. Anyway, he'll go either way with this idea, and I told him we'll discuss this further as a team at out next Soaring Council meeting this March. At a minimum, I hope that we'll be able to use these signs during the busy months. More to come...

Mentioned earlier above that Santa will bring you a new plane, or at least you'll be building or repairing a plane, be careful with sanding dust and fumes from glues and paints. Sanding dust from fiberglass and especially carbon fiber, is no bueno for the lungs. Also, CA glue, epoxy, polyester resin, and paint are equally harmful to your skin, eyes and respiratory system. Using gloves, a good mask, as well as being in a well ventilated area are essential. We all want you to be around for many more years so we can fly together and enjoy the world's best RC slope!

# F5J Thermal Duration Gliders with Electric Motor and Altimeter/Motor Run Timer

# Contest Report - Steve Condon

### TPG F5J officially launched in Poway

On Saturday, November 9<sup>th</sup>, the club hosted its first-ever F5J contest. We ended up with 9 pilots participating in the event and everyone had a good time with modest thermal conditions. Honestly, F5J is more fun than any of us expected!

If you are wondering "what the heck is F5J?" here's a brief overview - it is a man-on-man thermal soaring event that uses electric launched sailplanes with a maximum motor run of 30 seconds, a 10-minute tasks scored at 1 point per second and a 50-point landing @ 5 pts per meter. However, the catch is that there's a penalty for launch height...1/2 point per meter is deducted from the score up to 200 meters and then it jumps to 3 points per meter!





This may not sound like a big deal, but it's a game-changer for thermal soaring because it combines quick thermal detection skill (within about 20 seconds of launch), thermal flying skill, reading the competition skill and a little bit of poker risk vs. luck thrown in. In short, he who launches lowest <u>and makes the time</u>, wins. So, yeah...there are many opportunities for challenge and improvement. This is not a landing contest!

The other thing about this event is that it uses technology to run smoothly (and with few people) with an audio system that counts down the flight window to start and stop with periodic updates and a final countdown. This works along with a large timer display on the field so the timer/helper can keep their pilot updated. A huge THANK YOU goes out to Chuck Norris for some excellent hardware/software work creating a timer system that will work with both GliderScore (for F5J) and F3K Master (for DLG) so the timing board is versatile for the club's needs. Well done, Chuck!

# F5J Contest Report (continued)



Another big shout out goes to Cliff Hunter for learning the ropes of GliderScore just in time to run this contest and complete the scoring - nice work, Cliff! A special thank you to Chris Bajorek from the Sacramento area for his advice and counsel to both Cliff and me to get this contest to the finish line.

# Contest Report - Chuck Norris

The last contest in the TPG Monthly Contest/Clinic Series wrapped up on Saturday, November 16, with eight pilots in attendance. It was warm and sunny, with calm conditions in the early hours, with light winds pickup up from the west as the day progressed. Yours truly was the Contest Director for this event; only my second time CD-ing a contest. Things mostly went off just fine, but we had to hand-craft scorecards at the last minute because somehow I forgot to print them ahead of time. To quote Homer Simpson, "D'oh!"



Our new LED clockboard worked well, and everyone seemed to appreciate having the window time easily available. We've now tested it with both Glider Score in the F3J contest on the 9th and with F3K Master during this contest, so it's now fully tested and ready for normal club use.

We still managed to start reasonably on-time, thanks to Don Lochhead's abilities as an old-school scribe, and a bit of help from other pilots. Thanks guys!



# F3K/DLG Contest Report (continued)

Before the start, winds were minimal and lift had already started to develop, with soft but usable thermals pretty much everywhere you might search. By the time the contest started however, lift was harder to find, with only Don Lochhead able to get the 2:00 in "The Ladder" for round one.

Round two, "Five 2:00s", was also tough, with everyone struggling to get 2 minute flights. I'm not sure exactly when it happened, but Bruno Burgin managed to extract the T-peg from his Smile, which meant no more flying for him for the day.

In round 3, conditions were still poor for the first group, and everyone was on the ground by 2:05. All of us were on the ground, waiting for the window to expire, but some of us were paying more attention than others. Three pilots, including myself - launched for the second flight on the window *close* horn, not waiting for the next round to properly start. We quickly landed and re-launched at the correct time, a little embarrassed and with 100-point penalties. Unfortunately, the second flight was similarly tough, with everyone on the ground by the 2:22 mark. I had the longest flight on that one and was feeling pretty good about myself until I "again" launched on the window close horn, racking up a second 100 point penalty all in the same round. I again landed quickly and was ready for the proper launch horn, with appropriate heckling ringing in my ears. Note to self – "listen" to the clock!






# F3K/DLG Contest Report (continued)

Round 4 was "1:00, 2:00, 3:00, 4:00, any order" and again no one had an easy time of it. I don't recall anyone getting the 4:00 on their first flight, and it did not turn out to be a quickturn task because of the extra time we all earned flying short on one flight or another. Ray Pili and Mengchen Li had the most flight minutes of the round, with group B struggling a bit more as conditions worsened.

Round 5, the "Big Ladder", was again tough, with only Dale Osborn (yay Dale!) chalking up a full 3 minute flight. Ray Pili got the "K" in group A, and yours truly with the "K" in group B. My quick-turns were working pretty well and I managed to drop only 12 seconds on that task.

Round 6 was the dreaded "Poker" and by that time, the wind was picking up, and conditions were very tough. Playing it conservative paid off in both groups A and B, with Austin Gossard and me tying for top scores in group A with only 5:00 of flight time. Austin got his with five 1-minute flights, and although I struggled to get my 1:15 calls, I did manage to get four of them to tie with Austin. In round B, Mengchen and Ray dueled it out, but Mengchen sealed the deal with a phenomenal 2:57 "end of window" flight. What can I say, conditions were tough.

With the raw scores entered, I was in spot one, a very unfamiliar position for me. But we still had to figure out how to handle the train-wreck of All Up. After conferring with Gary Fogel, I simply followed the rules as written and gave everyone who launched early a 100 point penalty. Of course, since I did it *twice* that was 200 points of penalty for me, which cost me the lead spot leaving Mengchen Li in the lead!

Congratulations to Menchen - he flew very well (and followed the rules perfectly!) and earned the #1 spot! You may remember that Mengchen had his BAMF and transmitter stolen from his car while it was parked at UCSD, so he was flying his backup Snipe.

On another positive note, we had some new pilots visiting as well who are considering joining us next year.

Thanks to everyone who helped make the 2019 contest series a success! We had a total of 38 pilots participating in 2019, and I'm hoping we can keep participation growing in 2020!


