And of course, we awarded trophy plaques for the winners of club competitions and Modeler of the Year. Due to the low turnout for TD contests, no awards we given in this category.





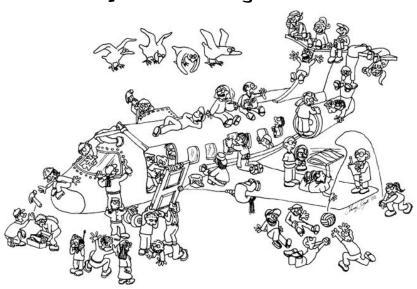

Thermal Duration/F5J Update - Tom Watson

As TPG's new Thermal Coordinator, I hope to build interest in our monthly contests not only from within the club ranks, but from the outside as well. TD contest participation across all of the SoCal clubs is on the decline, and events like the Visalia Fall Soaring Festival are also taking a big hit. Fewer accessible flying fields is a big factor, as well as the static pilot demographic...not much new blood coming into the hobby.

On the flip side, interest in F5J is on the rise and we hope this will help reinvigorate our contest series. Our 2020 thermal calendar consists of 10 events – alternating each month between traditional TD at the Encinitas field and F5J at Poway, with August and December off.

Thermal Duration/F5J Update (continued)





The following is the contest format we use:

- Thermal Duration Soring Contest, may be AMA sanctioned, AMA cards required to fly.
- Pilots Meeting: 8:45 am
- Entry Fee: \$5.00 for members and \$10.00 non-members Contest Director does not pay the entry fee! All fees go to maintenance of the equipment and field.
- Contest Starts: 9:00 am; ends around noon.
- Field mowed grass or dirt depending on the time of year
- Three Classes: Masters, Experts and Sportsman
- Computer Scoring at the field

Tasks: normally are 4 rounds, time in the air soaring, in minutes.

Scoring: normally 900 flight points and 100 landing points. The task and scoring are determined by the Contest Director (CD)

F3K/DIG Hand Launch Gliders

November Postal Report - Ray Pili

I Shems on RCGroups is promoting DLG flying over the winter months from November through March. We TPGers usually suffer wearing long pants and maybe a sweatshirt when flying. But for I Shem, who is from Europe, and DLG pilots from the northern hemisphere, snow is an issue.

I Shem has a thread on RCGroups with details on the Winter Postal (WP) (https://www.rcgroups.com/forums/showthread.php?2031476-F3K-Winter-postal-competition/page24).

In a nutshell, I Shem posts monthly tasks, and you fly the task. You can keep improving your score until the month ends. I Shems provides a scorecard to record your results, along with weather information, 1 or 1.5 m, so you can compare with others in a friendly competition. The monthly tasks are not your typical FAI F3K tasks, by any means. The tasks are announced in the RCGroups thread, a link to the score sheet and the results can be found on the thread. People have been posting photos. It's fun to see who's flying and the conditions they have to work with.

Scoring is on your honor and there is no prize.

A TPG Winter Postal series was set up at the Poway field, starting in November 2019 and are all on Saturdays.

The remaining dates are:

Jan 25, Feb 8 and March 7. An F3K Vault registration will be set up for each event, with a couple of warmup tasks prior to the main event.

November Postal Report (continued)

Nov 30th was the initial WP event. The task was called "3, 4, 5 in 6". You have a 20 min window and you score your three best flights with a max of 3, 4 and 5 min max. 6 flights only.

We had 6 pilots attend. Ron and Austin from Riverside and the rest from TPG.

We flew two warm up tasks; Big Ladder and 1,2,3,4. Then 3, 4, 5 in 6. Don and Gary scored Ks on the Big Ladder with Austin coming in 26 seconds behind Gary with a 956.

1,2,3,4 – Gary and I scored K's with Austin next with a 770.

These were warm up tasks and the air was getting better so on to 3, 4, 5 in 6. Austin, Gary and I scored K's, Ron with a Deviant flew a fantastic 974 dropping 19 seconds and Cliff right behind with a 933. Don wasn't so lucky.

F3K/DLG Hand Launch Gliders December Postal Report - Chuck Norris

With no monthly DLG contest scheduled for December, the December Winter Postal became the main event. For those of you who aren't aware, the Winter Postal is a winter contest series organized by RCGroups member "I Shems" out of Belgium. People from all around the world fly the same tasks and then send in their scores online.

This means every location is flying in totally different air, so some pilots will have a distinct advantage over others, but it's still a fun contest and great camaraderie with our fellow pilots around the world. The San Diego contingent had ten pilots flying.

This month's task was called the Double Dutch, and is something like Poker but has a 30 minute flight window and your flights are arranged in pairs. The first flight of each pair can be for any duration, but your second flight "must" be of equal or greater duration to the first one. More on this later.

Our fearless Contest Director, Don Lochhead, set up some F3K-"ish" tasks before Double Dutch to give us a chance to warm up and give us a full morning of flying. The air was tough, with all of us struggling to get flights longer than a minute and a half. This pattern persisted for most of the morning and made for some interesting flying.

December Postal Report (continued)

The first task was called "First and Last", and you score your first and last flights only with a 4 minute maximum in a 10 minute window. This means this is *not* a turnaround task, but the available air would not support anything near a 4 minute flight, so it would not have mattered if it did. The lift was elusive, with pilots finding, at best, neutral air. Launch height was a critical advantage, as was staying off the sticks and letting your aircraft cruise with minimal control

The second task was an invention of Don Lochhead - he calls it the "Big Slide". It's flown just like the Big Ladder except in reverse - you fly the 3 minute flight first, then 2:30, then 2:00 and so on. Flying in reverse, you don't have the usual ability to hunt out lift during earlier flights - you pretty much have to hook up on your first flight. Since the soft air stuck around, we all had to be content with scratching for neutral air and launching as high as we could throw.

Next was the main event, the Double Dutch. This allows unlimited flights, and as long as you make your times, every flight counts. So it is the Mother of All Quick-turn Tasks, with 30 minutes of quick-turns combined with trying to figure out a flying strategy that works with the unfamiliar task.

December Postal Report (continued)

As I mentioned, Double Dutch is flown using pairs of flights, which we called A and B. The A flight can be for any duration up to 5 minutes, and that time then becomes your target "must make" time for your B flight. So if you fly a 1:30 on your A flight, then you must fly for at least 1:30 on your B flight, or else the time doesn't count and you have to try again.

It's similar to Poker in this regard, although it feels very different while flying, especially during your A flights. When flying the A flight you have to constantly be thinking about your B flight and make sure not to push your time too hard or risk missing the B flight. Several of us made the mistake of getting lulled by better than average air on the A flight and then struggling with the B flight.

With the air remaining soft, the 30 minute window meant lots of launches, and I'm sure many of us felt it the next day. It made for a great quick-turn practice session, and since my QTs are starting to click, I found I enjoyed the task very much.

After "Double Dutch", Don finished off the day with a round of "All Up". The conditions never really improved much, and the 3:00 times were exceedingly tough to make.

Despite the tough conditions it was a fun day, and I personally enjoyed the new task formats. I could see "Double Dutch" working with a 10 minute window, so it would fit in just fine in a typical contest format.

2019 was a good year for Gulls DLG! The monthly contests have lived up to the goal of being welcoming to new and developing pilots, and I hope to continue this in 2020!

Happy New Year!!!

The TPG LSF Days at Poway will follow the Winter Postal (all Saturdays):

June 13 Aug 9 Oct 24

LSF attendance in the past few years has been waning. The club is hoping to turn this around in 2020. As the pilots progress up the ladder, tasks become much harder and may take months if not years to achieve.

If you have LSF Tasks that you need to check off, LMK. We will try to tailor an LSF date to help you achieve the task.

For example, Level II and above require competition experience. You can either place in the top three or gather enough points from multiple contests to achieve the goal. If you're a better sloper than thermal pilot, it might take you many thermal events to place, so why not plan a slope race? It does not have to be a full blown F3F race, but could be a Foamy MOM with signal flags. Who doesn't like a Combat session?

Lastly, eLSF is possible now that F5J is allowed at Poway.
