Message from the President

You may have heard rumors that the Federal Aviation Administration has begun enforcement of the new regulations regarding Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS). Unfortunately, our gliders are categorized with drones and fall within these regulations. According to unconfirmed reports, an AMA flying site in San Diego County was temporarily down shut due to noncompliance with the new FAA regulations by its members.

Simply put, recreational pilots flying a UAS weighing over .55 pounds are required to register with the FAA and display their registration number on the outside of their aircraft. You must also carry proof of completion of the FAA TRUST Certificate while flying. I want to encourage each of you to go online and get these two requirements taken care of. It should only take a few minutes. The TRUST certificate is free and designed to be fail proof. The cost of FAA registration (aircraft weighing .55 to 55 pounds) is \$5.00 and is valid for three years. Please be warned; there are a number of third-party websites offering FAA UAS registration at a huge markup. Make sure you use the official FAA website. Here are the links:

Annual Membership Dues are as follows:

- Full Members \$60 per year
- Youth Members (19 years or younger) \$5 per year
- Student Members (full-time) \$30 per year
- Receive a credit of up to \$20 on your annual dues. \$10 per each half-day working at any TPG flying field

New members joining in the first six months of the year pay the full rate. Those joining in July through September pay half the applicable rate. If you are a new member joining in October through December you pay the full rate but your membership is considered paid through the end of the following year. Student Members. Student members of the Society shall consist of those persons who have a current full-time student status at a college or university, have current membership (full or youth) in the AMA, have signified their interest in model aeronautics and a desire to be such a member of the Torrey Pines Gulls Radio Control Soaring Society, Inc. and have paid all requisite dues.

For all current and recently joined TPG members:

In order to maintain a line of communication among members, we have a TPG Google Group. Please make sure that our club Membership Chairman has your current email address. You can confirm this by contacting membership@torreypinesgulls.org. If you are not already a member of the TPG Google Group, you will be sent an invitation to join.



2022 Foamy F5J Clinic and Fun-Fly contest Series

For 2022 we will be continuing with our F5J Foamy events at Poway, with combined Clinics and contests scheduled for Saturday mornings from 9-12 on:

- May 28
- August 27
- November 5

Based on our popular DLG Contest and Clinic format, this year we are going to emphasize the "Clinic" aspect while continuing to fly contests. This is first and foremost a fun-fly event. So, if you are just getting started in F5J or just looking for an excuse to dig out your Foamy for a morning of relaxing flying this is the event for you.

The subject of the February Clinic will be tune-up tips for the Radian. These planes are pretty good right out of the box but many pilots have found ways to improve the flying characteristics even more. So come out prepared to show off your mod's and pick up even more tips. Future clinics will cover the aspects (rules, strategies, scoring, timer duties, etc.) of F5J contests that are a bit different from other TD events.

The contest element will be set up to emphasize the fun-fly aspect. We will have the field configured with landing tapes and the sound system. To get the most flying in for everyone, the flight window will be reduced from the regulation 10 minutes down to 7 minutes. We will plan on at least five rounds so everyone will get in plenty of stick-time.

We will ask everyone to pre-register on F3X Vault:

(https://f3xvault.com/?action=event&function=event_view&event_id=2048) and will be using self-entry of scoring results to give those of you who may not have used this system yet a chance to get some practice. Entry fees for the Clinic and contest will be free for TPG members and \$5 for non-members. We have opened a thread on RC groups so everyone can stay up to date on the event:

We are hoping that this event will help to introduce new pilots to what TPG has to offer. The council is considering the purchase of a club Radian that would be available for new members to learn to fly on. To make this work we will need some club members to offer to act as mentor pilots. If you would be interested, please contact any council member.

February F5J Contest Report - Steve Condon

We had a unique situation for our 5J contest this month in that it was in direct conflict with another F5J event at the same time. Warren Day, the CD for F5J in LA asked if we would be open to combining events and we agreed.

I was the CD for our TPG contest but since Warren was heading up the LA event that was held at the Free Flight field in Perris, CA, it made my workload as CD substantially lighter than usual (i.e. I didn't have to do anything, lol). Thank you Warren!

The turnout was very large for a local one-day contest that also coincided with Super Bowl Sunday...32 pilots! We flew 6 rounds with 4 groups per round and 8 lanes/competitors per heat. It was very efficiently run!

The weather that day was really something. With the humidity low, the temperature when we arrived at the field around 7am was an unbelievable 24°!!! It was chilly for sure but once the sun came out we started warming up and a few hours later it was 86° with spotty and very challenging thermal conditions. There were some crazy rounds where only one or two pilots got the full 10 minutes so scores were all over the place and there were some heart stopping low-level saves.

The contest concluded around 2:30 and everyone got to head out to enjoy the afternoon festivities with family and friends. Nine TPG pilots were in attendance: Tom Watson, Mike Smith, Don Van Gundy, Steve Condon, Cliff Hunter, Mike Verzuh, Tom Kiesling, Tim Traver and Sean Summers. Depending upon club member interest, additional LSF Attempt Day events may be scheduled

As you can see, Level I is not that difficult. With Poway and Torrey within fairly close proximity, it is absolutely possible to complete Level I in one day with help from witnesses.

LSF Report (continued)

In order to participate in the LSF program, please go to: https://www.silentflight.org/index.php/lsf-program/lsf-tasks. Bring the voucher as well as your AMA card to one of the TPG events and get started! It's as simple as that.

Submittal of a completed voucher is as follows:

1. Email the LSF Secretary John Marien: john@ne-aero.com a clear photo, or PDF scan of your completed (and signed by witnesses) Voucher.

That's it. No more sending money or sending your original hard copy.

John will then review your voucher and email you your acceptance or rejection of the voucher submission. If for some reason your voucher is rejected, you will have to adjudicate rejections with John.

Another nice change is while you are waiting for a reply you can down load a new voucher and start on the next level.

As a reminder, LSF is a 5 level program for RC Glider Pilots. Each level has increasingly more difficult tasks. LSF involves Slope flying, Thermal Flying, Spot Landings, Cross-Country Flying and Contest participation. Each level must be completed before proceeding to the next, which makes for a well-rounded RC Glider pilot.

The pure glider program is called SAP (Soaring Accomplishment Program). The electric launched glider program is called Electric SAP (eSAP).

This Month: Lenny Brzezinski, 2003 Modeler of the Year

Lenny Brzezinski came to the TPG through an interesting set of circumstances and in a short amount of time converted the TPG raffle at the club meetings into an amazing monthly success. With an interest in aviation, in about 1973 Lenny had bought his first RC glider. He built it, but couldn't afford a radio at the time. The glider ended up being given to a friend and it's not clear what became of it. With a new job at Rohr Industries, he moved from Encinitas to Chula Vista in 1979 to be closer to work. For those not familiar with Rohr, the company was founded by Fred Rohr, who was famous for having made the fuel tanks for Lindbergh's Spirit of St. Louis. Reuben Fleet helped Rohr found Rohr Aircraft Corporation in 1940 and by the 1960s they had expanded considerably. Rohr Industries produced the original subway cars for the BART system in the bay area as well as the Metro in Washington, D.C. among other products. Rohr remains a San Diego institution, now operated by the Collins Aerospace division of Raytheon.

Now armed with a solid job at Rohr, Lenny went out to a hobby store and purchased a kit for a Goldberg Sophisticated Lady. He built the glider and began flying it on his own from a hill near Proctor Valley Road. However, the first flight didn't go well and the glider crashed, requiring repairs. Fortunately another RCer from a club in Chula Vista was in the area the next time and he checked the aircraft and noticed that the angle of incidence was off with down elevator baked in on the Sophisticated Lady's t-tail configuration. Once this was fixed, the aircraft flew great and gave many hours of enjoyment for Lenny.

For Christmas in about 1980 or 1981 Lenny received a Gentle Lady kit from a friend in Imperial Beach. He enjoyed flying the Gentle

Lady and Sophisticated Lady on his own in the south bay. However, his interest in RC was off and on, and after being let go from Rohr, he moved to Utah and started working with a landscaper. It was the right move because the landscaper was also into RC gliders! Lenny bought a Sig Ninja sloper and flew that and other aircraft like a Sig Riser 100 from the famous Point of the Mountain soaring site south of Salt Lake City into the early 1990s. He bought a hi-start and started thermaling with the Riser 100.

In 1997, Lenny moved back to Chula Vista once again to work at Rohr, this time bringing his RC gliders with him. Somehow he became aware of the Torrey Pines Gulls and decided to check out a club meeting at the San Diego Air and Space Museum. He was hooked and signed up right away, as this really put his RC glider career in full motion. He bought a 3m thermal ship from Ron Scharck and a Sapphire from Patrick Dionisio and really had fun exploring thermal duration competition with the TPG at monthly contests at Poway. Arthur Markiewicz sold Lenny a Sharon Pro and, well, one wasn't good enough so Lenny bought another as a Christmas present to himself. In the late 1990s Lenny also became interested in aerotowing, flying for a time with the International Scale Soaring Association at meets in Apple Valley using a larger plane he purchased from George Joy. Lenny's skills at thermal duration improved and he began to work his way from novice to intermediate to expert class at the monthlies and also dabbled in hand launch gliding for a time.

In about 2001, Lenny volunteered to serve as the manager of the raffle at the club meetings. He took this job very seriously and worked closely with Discount Hobby Warehouse to bring some amazing stuff to each meeting: transmitters, kits, servos, receivers, Monokote, you name it, it was at the raffle. Lenny successfully ran the raffle for several years and attendance at the meetings definitely increased.

In the early 2000s Lenny was also at Torrey one day when the full scale sailplanes were operating. He took a ride in a Blanik and then took another. These were short hops but he was hooked. He joined the Associated Glider Clubs of Southern California, becoming their webmaster and also winch driver for many years. He even autotowed gliders at Jacumba using his truck. He never did get a glider license but enjoyed flying with friends and the beauty of soaring from the inside of the plane rather than the outside. I had the pleasure of interviewing Lenny for this article. He wished to convey to the club that "If you have any thoughts of flying at all, RC gliders or full scale gliders, pursue it! It is so much fun. Pursue what you want to do."

Lenny retired from Rohr in 2010 and still lives in Chula Vista. He was flying RC regularly from about 2010-2015 but hasn't flown in a while due to other diversions. Perhaps we can coax him back to Encinitas or Poway sometime soon!




